

# Overnight Schedule and Activity Description

<b>6:00 PM</b>	<b>Assembly on the Pier and Briefing</b> Group will assemble on Pier III in front of the submarine and meet the crew.
<b>6:15 PM</b>	<b>Gear Stowage</b> Participants will board the ship and stow their gear.
<b>6:30 PM</b>	<b>Torsk Tour</b> Full Tour of the ship
<b>7:30 PM</b>	<b>Evening Snack</b> Submarine Sandwiches in homage to the ship.
<b>8:00 PM</b>	<b>Hands-On Activity- "Signaling!"</b> Overnight participants learn how ships communicated during times of war including flaghoist, semaphore, and Morse code using flags and lamp-boards.
<b>8:30 PM</b>	<b>Hands-On Activity- "Ship Spotting!"</b> Overnight participants learn how military spotters identified ships during WWII. Participants will identify Japanese and American ships, including ones Torsk sunk during her career.
<b>09:00 PM</b>	<b>Scavenger Hunt</b> An old-fashioned scavenger hunt culminates the learning experience as overnight campers use what they have learned to discover answers in shipboard locations in a race against time.
<b>09:45 PM</b>	<b>Free Time &amp; Preparation for Lights Out</b>
<b>10:30 PM</b>	<b>Lights Out; Begin Night Watch.</b>
<b>07:00 AM</b>	<b>Reveille</b> Wake and pack gear.
<b>07:30 AM</b>	<b>Breakfast</b>
<b>08:00AM</b>	<b>Hands-on Activity: "Buoyancy Challenge!"</b> A lot needs to be considered when designing a sailing boat. Participants learn about the main considerations as they design and build their own boats that float. Using aluminum foil and newspaper participants create boats that float, and they compete to see whose boat can carry the most cargo.
<b>08:45 AM</b>	<b>Clean up, gear unloading.</b> Program concludes with a live-firing demonstration of one of the ship's great guns.
<b>09:00 AM</b>	<b>Debriefing and Departure</b> Overnight groups are welcome to tour our other ships after 1000am opening.
