

# Overnight Schedule and Activity Description

Please note, the schedule is subject to changes due to varying factors such as group arrival time and weather.

<b>6:00 PM</b>	<b>Assembly on the Pier and Briefing</b> Group will assemble on Pier I in Baltimore's Inner Harbor and meet the lead educator who will brief participants about safety and teach youth how to "toe-the-line", or fall-in for muster.
<b>6:00 PM</b>	<b>Gear Stowage</b> Participants will board the ship and stow their gear.
<b>6:15 PM</b>	<b>Introduction to shipboard life</b> Ship's Boys (any sailor under 18 held of "Ship's Boy) will fall in and be inducted into shipboard life
<b>6:30 PM</b>	<b>Hands-On Activity- "Brace the Yards!"</b> Overnight participants haul the lines (braces) that move the yards that hold the sails. Through teamwork and a lot of hauling, participants see how 20,000 square feet of canvas are made to catch the wind and propel the ship across the sea.
<b>6:45 PM</b>	<b>Hands-On Activity – "Anchor's Aweigh!"</b> Participants heave 'round the ship's capstan. The capstan was used for lifting and moving most of the heavy objects found on a ship such as the anchors and cargo.
<b>7:15 PM</b>	<b>Presentation: All Things Edible and Inedible: Food in the Navy!</b> The ship's cook leads a discussion about Civil War dining. Come and find out the difference between slush, squares, and dandyfunk, and what sailors could expect to eat while at sea.

<b>8:00 PM</b>	<b>Fire Drill &amp; Ship Tour</b>
<b>09:00 PM</b>	<b>Scavenger Hunt</b> An old-fashioned scavenger hunt culminates the learning experience as Ship's Boys use what they have learned to discover shipboard locations in a race against time
<b>9:30 PM</b>	<b>Preparations for Lights Out</b> Adults assigned to hammocks according to night watch billet. Youth fill in remaining hammocks.
<b>10:00 PM</b>	<b>Lights Out; Begin Night Watch.</b>
<b>07:00 AM</b>	<b>Reveille</b> Wake and pack gear.
<b>07:20 AM</b>	<b>Morning Muster and Inspection</b> Formation for morning muster and inspection.
<b>07:30 AM</b>	<b>Breakfast</b>
<b>08:15 AM</b>	<b>Hands-on Activity: Gun Drill!</b> This hands-on activity provides overnight participants with a first-hand experience at manning a mid-19 <sup>th</sup> century naval cannon. Participants learn by doing the teamwork and skill required to load and fire a 7,500 pound gun.
<b>08:45 AM</b>	<b>Hands-on Activity: "Commence Firing!"</b> Program concludes with a live-firing demonstration of one of the ship's great guns.
<b>09:00 AM</b>	<b>Debriefing and Departure</b> Overnight groups are welcome to tour our other ships after 1000am opening.
